We Are Waukesha Strong Compassion in the Aftermath of a Tragedy

T he long journey of healing is just beginning from the heartbreaking tragedy in Waukesha over Thanksgiving weekend. Many of us know someone personally affected, including families we serve through our Waukesha office, staff, and volunteers. Our hearts go out to each and every person impacted by this violent act.

From the first vigil and prayer service, our therapists have been present to offer our support and services. We are working closely with the Catholic Community of Waukesha to identify families who need us most to help with recovery. Nancy, our bilingual Outreach Case Manager, will also work with any family who may be struggling financially and emotionally through this difficult time.

Laura Ramos, Director of Community Counseling shares our sympathy, "I want to extend my condolences to the families of lost loved ones

and those who were physically injured in Waukesha's community Christmas parade. To those who were not physically injured, we know that seeing and knowing of loved ones being hurt can be extremely distressing."

"I am touched to see that the Waukesha community continues to mobilize to help those who were affected. I encourage anyone, including Spanish speaking families, who may need someone to talk with to contact our Waukesha office at (262) 547-2463."

Laura also explained that the COVID-19 pandemic is causing a sharp rise in people needing mental and behavioral health services. Families impacted by poverty face a variety of barriers to receiving the care they need. Whether it be financial, language, culture, or complexity of navigating health systems, Catholic Charities goal is to eliminate barriers to service for people affected by poverty.

Expanding Counseling Services to Washington County

When calls for mental health services in Washington County increased by over 2000% in 2020, from just 165 calls the year before to 3,857, the United Way of Washington County reached out to Catholic Charities and others to ask for help to begin to meet this need for youth and families.

Partnering with the local United Way, in September 2021, we opened a new office in West Bend with counseling services available Monday through Friday. Our plans include expanding services for the Spanish speaking population in the County with the aid of a bilingual therapist and a case manager.

While our focus is on serving youth and families in Washington County, who are affected by poverty and face barriers to quality mental health services, we will work with
