The client-led journey toward improved physical safety, mental health, and overall wellbeing is stewarded by the compassionate care of home coaching and coordination with case management and mental health therapy. **"We listen to our client's stories and life experiences. While we are supporting them, they are teaching us,"** Carla added, **"It's important to remember that loved ones with hoarding disorder are suffering a much deeper emotional experience than we can see on the surface."**
